# **Update from the Executive Director**


Welcome to the Winter 2023 edition of the Lower Savannah COG newsletter,

Council staff has gotten off to a quick start in 2023. The Human Service division is concluding the Area Plan detailing how we will work with our partners to provide aging services in the Region. In addition, our Mobility Management department is reviewing current Best Friends Express routes and identifying new user-friendly transit routes for the urbanized areas of Aiken County.

The Council is working across the region on comprehensive planning/zoning and economic development projects in Bowman, Allendale, Williston, Barnwell, Monetta, North Augusta, Jackson, Norway, and Denmark. In March, we conclude Needs Assessments in all six counties. And this month, with our state partners, we roll out the SC Brownfields Environmental Site Testing (SC BEST) program. This competitive program will pay to conduct Phase I and Phase II Environmental Site Assessments and other eligible environmental activities for local governments.

# Medicare Part D Open Enrollment 2023, UPDATE

# Center for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) is granting a Special Enrollment Period (SEP) for Exceptional Circumstances

Beginning January 1, 2023, the out-of-pocket cost for a month's supply of a "covered insulin product" for beneficiaries enrolled in a Medicare Part D plan will be capped at \$35. This \$35 cap will apply in all Part D coverage phased, including the deductible. All Medicare Part D plans, both stand-alone drug plans and Medicare Advantage plans, cannot charge more than \$35 for covered insulin products.

Beginning July 1, 2023, the out-of-pocket cost for beneficiaries who take insulin using a traditional pump covered by Original Medicare Part B as Durable Medical Equipment will also be capped at \$35 for a month's supply.

The Medicare Plan Finder may not reflect the changes to beneficiaries' out of pocket costs resulting from the new cost -sharing rules for covered insulin products.

CMS is granting a **Special Enrollment Period (SEP) for Exceptional Circumstances** to allow beneficiaries to add, drop, or change their Part D coverage if a better option is found after the Open Enrollment Period to cover insulin. This SEP will be available to all beneficiaries who use a "covered insulin product."

This SEP begins December 8, 2022, and ends December 31, 2023. Beneficiaries may use this SEP one time during this period for this reason. Call 1-800-MEDICARE to request a plan change with this SEP.

#### 5310 Urban Transit Program

The very popular 5310 Urban transit program is back. Anxious riders have been patiently waiting for funding made available which provides much needed transportation for seniors (ages 60 and above) and/or individuals with a disability in the urbanized portion of Aiken County. In the past year this program has experienced an increase in interest and ridership. Seniors and/or persons with a disability wanting to

#### Saturday Service Pilot

Alken County citizens have voted! The Saturday Service Pilot transportation program is finally here. Although there is a focus on transporting seniors, the Saturday shuttle serves all individuals living in and travelling to a destination within the urbanized areas of Aiken County between 9:00 AM and 4:00 PM on Saturdays (except if the Saturday falls on a Holiday). Funding for this pilot is made available through the SC Department of Transportation (SCDOT).

# Community Development Block Grants (CDBG)

It is that time of year to be thinking about potential infrastructure projects for your communities through Community Development Block Grants (CDBG).

The Spring round of CDBG focuses on public infrastructure such as water, sewer, road, and drainage improvements. To be eligible to apply a community must meet one of the three national objectives: the activity or project must benefit low-to-moderate income persons, aid or prevent slum or blight, or meet an urgent need.



Projects must be improvements or upgrades only. Matching funds of 10% are requested of the applying entity unless otherwise approved. We are happy to talk with anyone about developing community needs into a project but please be mindful that project development takes time. The sooner you start planning the stronger the project.

#### NADO Impact Award for the Economic Assessment of the LSCOG Region

Dr. Joey Von Nessen, Research Economist for the Moore School of Business at University of South Carolina, recently

presented the results of the Economic Assessment of the Six-County Region to the Lower Savannah Council of Governments Board of Directors.

The study was funded through the US Economic Development Administration (EDA) CARES Act Recovery Assistance. It assesses the economic history of the region as well as the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. It delves into key categories that are impactful to each community and the region such as population, education, occupations, and employment.
