The LSCOG Board of Directors was delighted to have two speakers at our February Board Meeting, Mr. Dan Ellzey (SCDEW Executive Director) and Dr. Walt Tobin (President of Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College).

Mr. Ellzey informed the LSCOG Board of current unemployment conditions and labor market data. The Workforce Reemployment Assistance Programming (WRAP) is the most recent program directed at early intervention and necessary training to obtain a better job or change professions, including a \$500 incentive for those that utilize this new program.

Dr. Tobin spoke to the board about workforce opportunities in our region. Partnerships with local high schools provide opportunities for students to earn some college credit. Some students can earn their Associate's degree before graduating high school. New education programs have been established for HVAC repair, pharmacy technician, and advanced EMT programs. A publication comes out twice a year from O-C Tech that highlights programs and incentives.



Medicare Part D Open Enrollment 2022

From October 15 - December 7, 2021, State Health Insurance Program staff assisted 254 clients from the Lower Savannah Region to review their coverage for 2022. The assistance provided results for significant savings to our citizens. For the new plan year 2022, the total savings for all clients who made changes could be as much as \$81,224.00.

During Annual Open Enrollment, Medicare beneficiaries can review and change their Medicare Part D or Medicare Advantage Plan coverage for the new year. Our SHIP staff are here to offer trusted, un-biased, one on one counseling and assistance so that the client can make the best decision for him or herself. Economic Development Administration (EDA) – Lower Savannah Region Current Initiatives

Lower Savannah COG staff has been working to update the Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) for the region. Over the past several months we have been meeting in each county with leaders and business and industry folks to gain a sense of the economic climate in our various



communities. To date, we have met Allendale, Calhoun, and Bamberg counties and we will meet in Orangeburg, Barnwell, and Aiken counties over the next six weeks. We have been discussing the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats as they relate to economic development. We had great feedback and see that while there are some common themes across our region, each county has unique offerings for successful economic development. We will continue to compile our data and research to produce a draft of the 2022 – 2027 Comprehensive Development Strategy for the Lower Savannah Region by the end of June 2022. To ensure that we receive as

many comments as possible, we post the draft for public comments as well as host a community input session in July, 2022.

EDA CARES Recovery Act Assistance Grant Update

LSCOG was award an EDA supplemental grant in 2020, EDA's CARES Recovery Act Assistance. These funds were granted to our region to support the pandemic recovery and resiliency due to the impacts of COVID -19. Our overall scope of work focused on two phases in reviewing the needs of the region. The first phase was to gauge the impacts and need. Through our extensive review, the COVID-19

Phase 1 Recover and Resiliency Plan identified that the highest impacts were associated with the labor market in the region. By identifying these impacts, LSCOG was able to contract Dr. Joey Von Nessen of the University of SC Moore School of Business to conduct a labor market analysis of the region. With Phase II is coming to an end, Dr. Von Nessen will give a brief presentation of his findings at the LSCOG full board meeting on June 10th, 2022. After the meeting, LSCOG will work to distribute "Lower Savannah Council of Governments: Post COVID Assessment of Six-County LSCOG



Region". This assessment will cover the economic impacts of COVID-19 to the region as well as identify future opportunities for the region.

Lower Savannah SC Works Job Fair Tour

The Lower Savannah SC Works Job Fair Tour continues throughout the region with its most recent stop in Orangeburg County. The job fair was held on April 7, 2022, at Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College from 10:00am-2:00pm. There were 51 employers present and 109 job seekers in attendance. Upcoming stops on the tour include Allendale County on May 5th at the Brandt Building in Allendale and Barnwell County on June 2nd at Barnwell High School. Power Up Your Future

Lower Savannah Council of Governments' Workforce Development held two "Power Up Your Future" events for high school students in the Lower Savannah Region and Edgefield County.

The first event was held at USC-Aiken for Aiken, Barnwell, and Edgefield County high school students on March 15, 2022, 465 students and parents attending. The focus was to provide students with





information regarding their opportunities following graduation. Seventy-nine businesses and community services agencies attended and 21 colleges, postsecondary training providers, and all branches of the military were in attendance. The BE PRO BE PROUD double expandable 18-wheeler mobile workshop was on site and includes eight simulators which aims to get high school students' interest and help them realize various career opportunities in trade fields. Sponsors donated \$3,500 for scholarship drawings and approximately 40 door prizes. The event was held in partnership with the SC Department of Commerce, Aiken County Public Schools and the University of South Carolina - Aiken.



The second event was held on April 28, 2022, at South Carolina State University for high school students from Allendale, Bamberg, Calhoun, and Orangeburg Counties. The 561 students attended and started out with guest speaker, Brooks Harper, and finished with opportunities to speak with over 53 business representatives and 28 universities, colleges and post-secondary training providers, along with

military representatives from all branches. Approximately \$2,000 in scholarships

were awarded

and over 50 door prizes were given out. Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College was on-site and provided eight simulation opportunities for the students. The event was held in partnership with South Carolina Department of Commerce and Orangeburg County School District.
